

# CA State Senate District 32 Nutrition Insecurity Dashboard: September 2023



<b>What is "nutrition insecurity"?</b> "Nutrition insecurity" is not having reliable access to 3 healthy meals a day. San Diego Hunger Coalition estimates the nutrition insecure population to be households with income below 200% of Federal Poverty Level (\$60K/year for a family of 4). Research indicates this to be a conservative estimate of the population needing food assistance to obtain adequate daily nutrition.
